Hello everyone,

There are various ways we can become indebted to people in our lives. Whether it's from a mortgage, loan, or paying back one good deed for another. However, the debt that will be the most difficult to attempt to repay will be one where the debtor, or one who the debt is owed to, will never ask, expect, or demand back from you. Because this debt has come in the form of a sacrifice. The debtor knew you needed it, opportunity or circumstance gave them a means to do it, and whatever the cost at the time required of them they did it. There was no price tag attached because it was priceless. In both what the debtor did and how it affected you. This is the one debt of all that you owe that you hope and pray the opportunity comes to repay. On the evening of March 8th my best friend, constant companion, and most loyal, understanding sidekick for the past 4 years, Pal, an 8-year-old Scottish terrier went missing after meeting a female companion. A long-time thrift store customer Ms. Glover had seen him wandering aimlessly down the sidewalk on 1st Ave and decided to take a picture of him. Moving along, after he was handed to me, I was asked by one of the workers whose hand was bandaged up if Pal has all his shots. My response to this was yes but with a question mark on my face. The worker then informed me of the difficulty he and his co-worker experienced in detaining my friend. That was all he asked of me, no reward or compensation of any kind. Just a look of relief to be offloading him as well as a zero chance of contracting any type of illness for their kind, timeconsuming, selfless act. Take what you will from this true story. The goodness still found in the human spirit. Perhaps, the spiritual aspect of maybe just how Jesus might feel when we "wander off" and then we return home. Thank you to Ms. Glover and the two city of Albany workers. I pray for the day I can pay the debt I owe each of you. Human kindness is personified in you. To those who are reading this, Jesus has already paid your debt. When are you coming home to thank him for it?
